



## FIRE WEATHER WATCH IN EFFECT FOR TUESDAY

### FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

A cold front will move through the region early Tuesday morning and usher in a dry and breezy airmass. This watch will likely be upgraded to red flag warnings for portions of the area.

There is a Fire Weather Watch in effect from Tuesday late morning through Tuesday afternoon for low humidity and gusty north winds.

The National Weather Service in Houston/Galveston has issued a Fire Weather Watch which is in effect from Tuesday morning through Tuesday afternoon.

- Wind: north 15-30 MPH
- Humidity: 18-25%
- Highest threat is located west of interstate 45 and north of interstate 10.
- Impacts: any fires that develop will likely spread rapidly. Outdoor burning is not recommended.

### Precautionary/Preparedness Actions

A Fire Weather Watch means that critical fire weather conditions are forecast to occur. Listen for later forecasts and possible red flag warnings.
